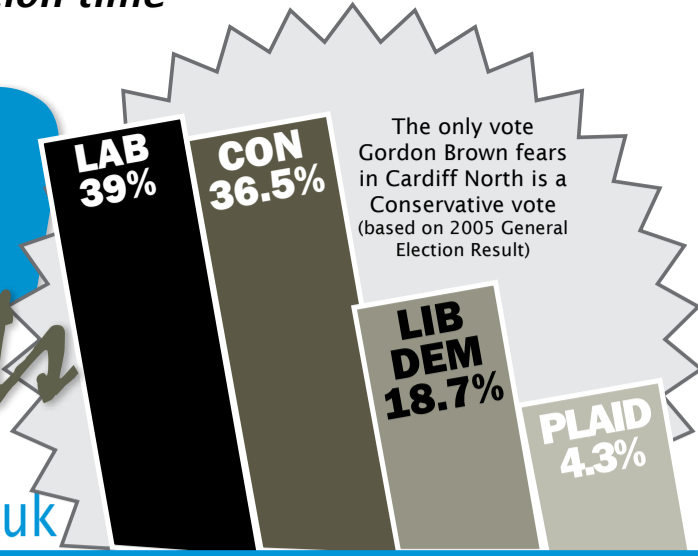

WHAT JONATHAN AND A CONSERVATIVE GOVERNMENT WOULD DO FOR STUDENTS

The proportion of young people going to university has scarcely changed in eight years. At the current rate, it would take Labour over a century to meet their 50 per cent target.

A Conservative government will:-

- Create 10,000 extra university places in 2010
- Introduce an early repayment bonus on student loans
- Offer a fairer deal for part-time and mature students
- Create a clearer pathway from vocational routes into further and higher education.

Jonathan Evans commented: "The Conservatives recognise that higher fees have brought benefits to universities, but we need to ensure that they are providing a better student experience in return."

The Conservatives would save money in higher education with supply-side reform to set Universities free by cutting excessive red tape, scrapping unnecessary quangos and creating a streamlined funding model where government funding follows the learner.

CARDIFF STUDENTS' UNION TURNS DOWN £5K DONATION IN MOMENT OF MADNESS

Cardiff University Conservatives have called for answers after the Student Union's 'Go Global' programme of events to promote diversity was doomed to lose over £5000 after a Union meeting opted to refuse an offer from Barclays Bank to cover the programme's costs on "ethical grounds".

Barclays, which has 148,000 UK employees, has previously donated money to the Red Cross and operates a policy of non-engagement with the tyrannical governments of Burma and the Sudan. The money was volunteered on an entirely charitable basis. It was refused following speeches from members of the Socialist Worker's Society, who even went so far as to cry "We can't take their blood money!".

Cardiff University Conservative Deputy Chairman Adam Johns reacted "We can't allow our Union to be run by out-of-date Marxists. The costs of the worthy Go Global programme could have been met without troubling the Union's budget, but now this additional cost will come back to bite Cardiff students in the form of more expensive drinks and tickets to the Union's club nights. The Societies Council has made itself look stupid to the Union's own members."
