

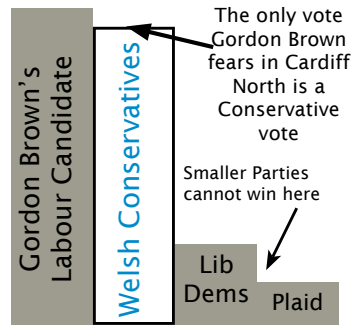

WHITCHURCH RALLIES

BEHIND ITS SCHOOLS



There has been a huge response to the Whitchurch campaign to support our local schools. In addition to public meetings people have been signing petitions and writing to object to the plans.

The message to the council is clear. The people of Whitchurch believe that there is enough demand for both Eglwys Newydd and Eglwys Wen to be retained, that our high school should not be punished for the failings of others and our Welsh medium school requires investment.

Your councillors for Whitchurch, together with Jonathan Morgan AM and Jonathan Evans, are working as a team to defeat these plans. "We want to restate our support for our Whitchurch schools. We are giving our full backing to the campaigns led by parents and governors, and strongly believe that the Lib Dems and Plaid simply don't like successful schools and parental choice", commented Jonathan Evans.

In a new development the Labour Party voted against our high school's plan to gain foundation status. We support Whitchurch High School and believe that foundation status will help protect the school and the education opportunities of local children.

Councillor Tim Davies commented: "Labour, the Lib Dems and Plaid are all against Whitchurch. We hoped this wouldn't be political but their

Whitchurch to have “shoppers” car parks

After campaigning by Whitchurch and Tongwynlais Councillors it has been announced that a 3 hour maximum stay is to be implemented in two Whitchurch car parks.

The new parking rules will be enforced by cameras using Number Plate Recognition Technology. The aim of this is to end the long stay car parking which currently occupies up to half of all the available parking, taking spaces away from people wishing to shop in and around Whitchurch village. These plans should increase business in Whitchurch, bringing money in the local community.

Work is due to begin towards the end of November and be completed early in the new year. Work will mainly be carried out on Sundays to reduce disruption to drivers and residents.

How we plan to help...Pensioners

Over the last 12 years, the culture of savings in Britain has been eroded. Thanks to a decade of irresponsible lending and borrowing with pension funds being raided, everyone in Britain is now landed with huge levels of debt with Pensioners left particularly vulnerable.

Conservative Parliamentary candidate Jonathan Evans told In Touch “The Conservative Party will raise the basic state pension in line with earnings to help stop the spread of the means test. At the same

time, we will look at how we can simplify the rules and regulations around pensions to encourage companies to offer high quality pension provision to all employees.” Jonathan added, “However, there is no easy way out of the financial black hole that Gordon Brown has led this country into. In order to safeguard people’s retirement income, the state pension age will rise by one year for men to 66 from 2016 and 65 for women from 2020. This is how we can guarantee dignity and security for pensioners.
